Financial Assistance can be provided for emergency health and housing needs only. Applicants must be able to show that an emergency exists, that they have done all they can to resolve the problem on their own, and that they will be able to be financially self-sufficient in the future. "Hana Pono'i - Striving Towards Self-Sufficiency" seminar provides basic nutrition and budget counseling.
